

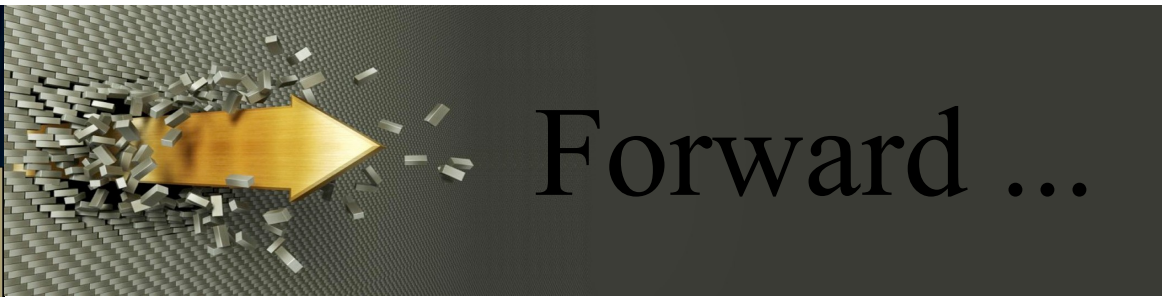

On October 17, 1961, twenty-six Baptist Churches in northern Pulaski County met at Sylvan Hills Baptist Church for the purpose of establishing a new association. These churches, and two that could not be present for the meeting, were a part of the Pulaski Baptist Association and still enjoyed a good fellowship with them. However, *“for some time there had been a growing feeling among the pastors and leading laymen of the churches north of the river, that there would be closer fellowship and a greater cooperative spirit in a less massive body...a smaller association where leadership development could be accessible to more people.”*

The newly formed association pledged its support to the Arkansas Baptist State Convention and its leadership. Of utmost important to our spiritual parents was the need to reach the community in which they lived and strive to make it better by sharing the good news of Jesus Christ with our neighbors.

In 2011, we find ourselves still adhering to the things important to those who walked before us. Their legacy is our present testimony and our legacy is being established by our actions and testimonies.


